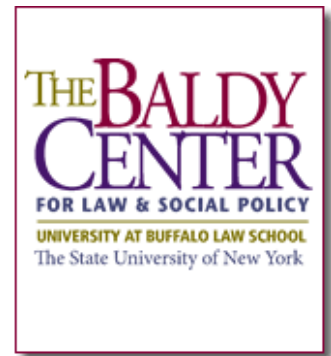

## Current Changes in Immigration Law

Mark Popiel, Director  
UB Office of Immigration Services

Mark Popiel will examine and expand on the numerous issues associated with the temporary, as well as permanent, admission of foreign nationals to the United States. Also, he will look at the impact that processing delays, visa denials, and greater scrutiny has played on the mobility of people and the costs of doing business in today's marketplace.

As the Director of Immigration Services at the State University of New York at Buffalo, Mark Popiel represents foreign faculty, scholars, researchers, and other staff members in the processing of temporary and permanent residency immigration cases. He is also an internationally published author of various articles pertaining to International and Immigration Law. His most recent co-authored project entitled "Tightening The United States Immigration Laws In The 21st Century" is being published by the Chinese Journal of International Law located in Beijing, China.
