From the Public Law of Europe to International Law and Back Again?

What are the implications of the bureaucratization of democracy for doing law and politics? Do the various enlargements of the EU, and the reproduction of the European integrationist model in different parts of the world, suggest a new form of international law?

Pierre d'Argent is Professor of Public International Law at the University of Louvain, Belgium. He teaches External Relations Law of the EU. He is also the author of a prize-winning book on war reparations, and of numerous journal articles. He also appeared as Counsel before the International Court of Justice.

Mark Drumbl is Associate Professor of Law and Ethan Allen Faculty Fellow at Washington and Lee Law School. He is Associate Editor, *Columbia Journal of Transnational Law*, as well as the author of many law review articles and essays.
