Isabel Marcus (J.D. and Ph.D. Political Science, University of California at Berkeley) is a Professor of Law whose research interests include domestic violence, women's international human rights and feminist legal theory. She has presented guest lectures and taught in over 15 countries, and she founded and served as director for both the UB Institute for Research and Education on Women and Gender and the UB Domestic Violence Clinic. She has served as legal consultant for numerous domestic and international organizations, including the Network of East-West Women. Her most recent book *Dark Numbers: Domestic Violence, Law and Public Policy in Hungary and Poland, Romania and Russia* was recently submitted for publishing, and she has also published articles on domestic violence and women's international human rights in Serbian, Hungarian, Romanian, and Polish.
