The words create obligations, and great precision is required: in word choice, punctuation, and sentence structure. Although students will edit and draft both statutes and contracts, the focus is less on drafting a particular type of document than on learning skills needed for effective drafting. The course will be fully remote, with live sessions on Zoom devoted primarily to working through drafting exercises. The goal of this course is to make you more comfortable with drafting legal documents to enable you to quickly produce excellent work in practice. During this course, you will improve your writing skills, sharpen your legal analysis and strategy, and further develop your editing ability. You will draft one document per class, with time for collective review, followed by individual editing and rewriting. The documents you will draft include a statute, a contract, jury instructions, a demand letter, a complaint/answer, a notice of motion/motion, interrogatories, an opinion letter, a will, and a statement of facts (both objective and persuasive).
