Name	Description
Adelbert Moot Scholarship	This award was established in 1931 by Carrie Van Ness Moot to provide annual scholarships to worthy students, who exhibit academic excellence and financial need.
Alan Carrel Award	to provide an award to a law student who best demonstrates the values exhibited by Alan Carrel during his career by making a significant impact through public service.
Albert Eli Moss Scholarship	To be used to provide scholarship awards to deserving men and women pursuing legal studies at the State University of New York at Buffalo School of Law. First preference to deserving residents of Niagara County and second preference to deserving residents of Erie County.
Alden-Baldy Scholarship	This scholarship was established in 1956 by various members of the alumni and Christopher Baldy to provide assistance to students who without such help would be unable to achieve their goal of becoming members of the bar. Second- and third-year students are eligible for this scholarship.
Anthony J. Colucci Jr., Esq. '58 Law Review Scholarship	Will be awarded to UB School of Law students who are members of the Buffalo Law Review and who have demonstrated outstanding academic performance as well as financial need.
Candace and James Vogel Book Scholarship	To support an award(s) to an upper-class student of the School of Law at the University at Buffalo with a strong interest in tax (preferably corporate tax).
Class of 1966 Award	to provide an award to a second- or third-year law student who has made a significant impact at the Law School through volunteer or extra-curricular activities at the Law School
Class of 1968 Award	To provide an award to student(s) at the University at Buffalo School of Law who are in good academic standing and who have financial need
Edith and David Goldstein Award	Awarded to a student who has achieved excellence in debtor creditor or bankruptcy

Frederick C. Ebert Scholarship	To provide an annual scholarship to a student at the University at Buffalo Law School who has demonstrated strong commitment to public service and is interested in the pursuit of a career serving the public interest after completing law school. The student must also demonstrate financial need and be in good academic standing. In addition, the student should have substantial work experience prior to law school, and should be pursuing a law degree to either advance an existing career or to make a career change.
Henry Rose Book Scholarship	to fund scholarships to be awarded to upper-class law students. The scholarships are designated to cover the cost of books and other mandated course materials. The scholarship(s) shall be awarded to one or more students in their second or third year of study at SUNY Buffalo Law School who have demonstrated both exemplary performance in Law School coursework and financial need. Preference will be given to students who are members of the Buffalo Law Review and/or officers of the Student Bar Association.
Hon. Eugene W. Salisbury Scholarship	to support JD students at the Law School. The selection of each Hon. Eugene W. Salisbury Scholar will be based upon academic merit and financial need, with preference for a qualified candidate who is also supporting or helping to support one or more dependents.
Hon. John T. Elfvin Scholarship	To provide scholarships to one or more students in their second or third year of study at the University at Buffalo Law School who (a) demonstrate academic excellence, (b) have participated in the Law School Trial Advocacy or Moot Court Programs and (c) work while attending law school.
Hon. Michael A. Telesca Scholarship	Established in honor of the Honorable Michael A. Telesca to provide a scholarship to a student at the University at Buffalo Law School who has demonstrated financial need, and who is in good academic standing.
Honorable Robert Foster Thompson Memorial Scholarship	To provide scholarships to deserving students at the University at Buffalo School of Law who are providing for their educational expenses through some type of employment

Jacob D. Hyman Scholarship	Established in 1994 by Mr. Hilary Bradford to provide an annual scholarship(s) to admitted student(s) at the University at Buffalo Law School demonstrating financial need, exceptional character and ability, in addition to a strong commitment to outstanding professional and community service. Recipients shall be graduates of public high schools in the 4th Judicial Department with preference given to graduates of public high schools in the 8th Judicial District.
Jacob Weissfeld Scholarship	This award was established in 1992 by Richard A. Weissfeld to provide an annual scholarship to students exemplifying skills as a trial lawyer and demonstrating financial need.
James M. McMahon Memorial Scholarship	To provide support for a scholarship(s) to law students who demonstrate financial need in the School of Law at the University at Buffalo.
John F., Mary A. and Robert J. Lane Scholarship	This scholarship was established to provide assistance to students who are in need of financial aid and have distinguished themselves academically.
Joseph G. Terrizzi '65 Award	to provide need based financial awards to first generation law students
Joseph P. Peperone Memorial Scholarship	To provide scholarships to second- and third-year students of the University at Buffalo Law School who are well rounded and of exceptional character, with preference given to a graduate of a Western New York High School who has some journalism background.
Joseph P. Runfola Sr., JD '50 and Isabella Runfola Scholarship	provide an annual scholarship to law school students who have completed an undergraduate degree at the University at Buffalo, are from the Buffalo area and who have made a positive impact in the Buffalo community.
Law School Scholarship	Established by members of the law school to provide scholarships to students at the University at Buffalo Law School demonstrating financial need and academic achievement.
Lawrence H. Wagner '49 Endowment Award	to provide an award to Law School students who have demonstrated truly outstanding academic performance, as well as financial need
Lipsitz, Green, Scime, Cambria Scholarship	This scholarship was established to provide students who possess financial need, and academic excellence with assistance.

Martin A. Feinrider Scholarship	To provide a scholarship to a student at the University at Buffalo Law School who has demonstrated financial need and a strong commitment to human rights and/or disarmament.
Matthew J. Schnirel Memorial Scholarship	Provides an annual scholarship(s) to one or more students in their third year of study at the University at Buffalo Law School. The scholarship will be given to students who have participated in the Law School Trial Advocacy program and who are in good academic standing. Preference will be given to students who work while going to school, partake in outside activities, or do volunteer work.
